



### **Today she is called Farida Robles**

Florence Nightingale died in London on 13<sup>th</sup> August 1910. She is The Role Model for nurses across the globe. At the Hospital Diospi Suyana the Peruvian Farida Robles is following in her footsteps. For ten years now she has worked exceptionally and exemplary in the treatment of our patients. Yesterday, Tuesday, was the last time that this fact was proven true. Having undergone gynaecological treatment three women were sitting at their communal breakfast table. This early mobilisation is due solely to the head nurse who pays attention to such important things. Her surname "Robles" translates as "oak". Her sacrificial care for our patients is solid and lasting. Hence for Farida Latin expression rings true: "nomen est omen".
